4.1 Vice President's Report

4.1.1 Merchandise Sale 2017

- 4.1.1.1 The first merchandise sale for this semester was on week 1, 24th to 28th July from 10am to 3pm at the foyer.
- 4.1.1.2 The merchandises sold were varsity jackets (available in blue and maroon), bottles (available in blue and silver), and gym bags.
- 4.1.1.3 The most popular product was the varsity jackets.
- 4.1.1.4 In total, 579 varsity jackets, 114 bottles, and 24 gym bags were sold, thus generating a revenue of RM 40,185.
 - 4.1.1.5 The response from students were great, and there were also staff members and alumni purchasing the jackets.
 - 4.1.1.6 There were still some defective varsity jacket pieces (buttons falling off) and students have exchanged those pieces for good pieces.
 - 4.1.1.7 Overall, the sales were better than expected and we would like to thank MUSA members and subcommittees who had helped out and supported the sales.

4.3 President's Report

4.3.1 Circular by government for outdoor activities

- 4.3.1.1 There has been a circular from the Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE) that due to certain instances, outdoor activities that involve river rafting, jungle trekking and etc. are to be put on hold until safety guidelines are determined and implemented.
- 4.3.1.2 MUSA departments and clubs are to adhere to these guidelines.
- 4.3.1.3 Further information will be disseminated when received.
- 4.3.1.4 The circular is issued as there is no definite guide on who is to be liable should there be any injuries of the students.
- 4.3.1.5 President emphasized that students were not allowed to leave by themselves amidst an outdoor event held by any department.

4.3.2 Constraints of space

- 4.3.2.1 All departments are to understand that due to the lack of space, there are severe problems with opening booths and hosting events.
- 4.3.2.2 Please note that we are working with the University to find the best way possible throughout the semester.

4.3.3 Seat hogging campaign

- 4.3.3.1 Library and Learning Commons (LLC) organized a seat hogging campaign during the SWOTVAC and exam period of Semester 1.
- 4.3.3.2 Received mix feelings from the student body through official emails and social media responses.
- 4.3.3.3 Welfare Officer had discussed with LLC on this matter and will elaborate further.

4.3.4 MUSA website

- 4.3.4.1 Publicity Officers initially wanted to set up a new website to serve as the MUSA website to reflect a more dynamic and trendy council.
- 4.3.4.2 Discussions were held with myself, the General Secretary and the Publicity Officers.
- 4.3.4.3 Decided to remain with the current official website but update it with the necessary amendments.
- 4.3.4.4 General Secretary will elaborate further.

4.3.5 SWOT VAC tutorial rooms availability

- 4.3.5.1 Increased capacity for students to study during SWOT VAC and exam periods for Semester 1 amounting to a total of 500 spaces.
- 4.3.5.2 The areas include:
 - 4.3.5.2.1 Building 9 (Level 3 & Level 4): 24/7
 - 4.3.5.2.2 Library extended area: 24/7
 - 4.3.5.2.3 Computer lab 9, 10, and 11: 8am-11pm
 - 4.3.5.2.4 Library: 8am-12am (Weekdays) & 10am-12pm (Weekends)
 - 4.3.5.2.5 Tutorial rooms (6401 & 6402): 8am-8pm (Weekdays)





- 4.3.5.2.6 New building cafeteria: 8am-12am
- 4.3.5.3 Awaiting data from the Facilities Management Department (FMD) to determine if more spaces are required for Semester 2.

4.3.6 MUSA Elections and Constitution

- 4.3.6.1 MUSA Constitution, MUISS Constitution, and C&S Constitution has been merged together.
- 4.3.6.2 The necessary amendments have been made and the new master MUSA Constitution has been disseminated to the MSC for consideration and feedback.
- 4.3.6.3 Besides that, the electoral process has begun as of Week 2.
- 4.3.6.4 All MUSA members and its subdivisions are to remain neutral throughout this period.
- 4.3.6.5 General Secretary will elaborate further on the Constitution and the Elections.

4.3.7 MUSA FORUM updates

- 4.3.7.1 Conducted the first MUSA FORUM on the 12th of April 2017.
- 4.3.7.2 Feedback was collected and sent to the University and MUSA departments for deliberation.
- 4.3.7.3 Feedback from the University has been received.
- 4.3.7.4 I have discussed with the Editors and plan to create a video to communicate the updates to the student body via our social media platforms.
- 4.3.7.5 Shooting of the video is to commence on the 5th of August 2017.
- 4.3.7.6 The next MUSA FORUM will be organized after the updates of the last forum has been disseminated thoroughly among the student population.

4.3.8 Health and Wellness Week

- 4.3.8.1 The School of Medicine and Health Sciences Representatives have proposed to organize a programme that advocates both physical and mental health.
- 4.3.8.2 The First Aiders Bureau also would like to organize a "Health Awareness Week"
- 4.3.8.3 Customarily, the Welfare Officers organize the Health and Wellness Week together with the University.
- 4.3.8.4 MUISS would also like to be part of the Health and Wellness Week.
- 4.3.8.5 The University has decided that there will be only one Health and Wellness Week but we are to incorporate all the ideas from the respective parties.
- 4.3.8.6 Meeting is to be set with Welfare Officer, School of Medicine and Health Sciences Representatives, First Aiders Bureau and MUISS to organize this as best as possible.

4.3.9 Human Library





- 4.3.9.1 The Human Library initiative is an initiative that has individuals represent their experiences (somewhat like a book).
- 4.3.9.2 A few books have been identified namely:
 - Transgender
 - Sentul boy
 - Autism
 - Celebrity
 - The Homeless CEO
 - Sexually Abused
- 4.3.9.3 These individuals will be invited to our campus to share their experiences on these topics.
- 4.3.9.4 Dates for this initiative is yet to be finalized.

4.3.10 MUSA Info Week

- 4.3.10.1 MUSA Info Week is to allow students who are interested to run for the Annual Elections to be able to mingle and understand our job scopes better
- 4.3.10.2 Components of the Info Week include:
 - 7th till 10th specific timeslots will be determined for students to approach us regarding elections
 - 7^{th} and 10^{th} will be at the foyer
 - 8th and 9th will be at the MUSA offices
 - giving out badges and cookies
 - a board will be positioned to notify students on available positions for each ticket registered for the elections and updated on a daily basis by the EC.
- 4.3.10.3 Publicity Officers to elaborate further.

4.3.11 Suicide Prevention Day

- 4.3.11.1 The Counselling department would like to organize the Suicide Prevention Day in light of the recent increase in suicide cases by young adults and students.
- 4.3.11.2 They would require assistance from MUSA to make it an interactive and exciting event to attract the students' interest.
- 4.3.11.3 Welfare Officer has been briefed and will elaborate further.

4.3.12 TEDxMonashUniversityMalaysia

- 4.3.12.1 The Vice-President department together with the School Representatives (Business, Science, IT and Medicine) are involved in the first TEDx event on campus.
- 4.3.12.2 26th of August 2017
- 4.3.12.3 Require volunteers from the entire MUSA on that day for the many roles
- 4.3.12.4 Coordination meeting with major campus departments i.e. Events Office, Security, ITS, FMD, Student Experience and etc. have been set for the 7th of August 2017.
- 4.3.12.5 Vice-Presidents' will elaborate further.





4.3.13 Monash Billboard/Classified

- 4.3.13.1 The Monash University Postgraduate Association (MUPA) would like to explore the option of putting forward a collaborative effort to set up the first every Monash Malaysia billboard/classified.
- 4.3.13.2 Many students have a hard time selling or trading of their items particularly international students when they complete their studies and are planning to head back home.
- 4.3.13.3 There is no online website for Monash students that can sell their items to other Monash students.
- 4.3.13.4 Students can sell any myriad of items from books to cars and etc.
- 4.3.13.5 We will be replicating other models from other universities as a guideline for the billboard.
- 4.3.13.6 Meeting to discuss this initiative will be held during Week 3.

4.3.14 Update lists

- 4.3.14.1 An Excel sheet (update list) was disseminated to all MUSA departments on the 22nd of June 2017 to be completed with the events/initiatives, dates and updates respectively.


